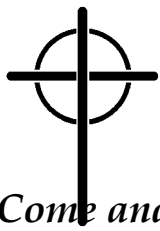

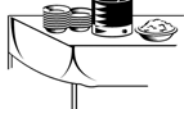
Christmas Greetings from the Allens

Thoughts and Reflections on Stewardship

A steward originally was an officer or employee of a household entrusted with the general administration of its affairs. Such a person of trust, however, could be abused as in the parable of the unjust or dishonest steward. (Read Luke 16:1-13). We are all familiar with the words of Jesus, "No servant can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money."

In Corinthians 4:2 Paul says it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy. Figuratively the word in the sense of one who acts as a custodian, administrator or supervisor has received a spiritual meaning (1 Peter 4:10). "As each has received a gift, employ it for one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

Here the word stewardship has great importance in the life of the individual Christian and the practical work of the church. Christian stewardship is the practice of systematic and proportionate giving of time, abilities and material possessions, based on the conviction that these are a trust from God to be used in his service for the benefit of all mankind in grateful acknowledgment of Christ's redeeming love.

How fortunate we are in our church to be surrounded by cheerful givers. Many years ago I received a bid for the outside painting of our church from a church member. When I showed the bid to my late husband, he said, "That is fine. He will give it all to the church."

Another member who makes extra money transporting people to the airport uses that extra as an additional church gift.
