## From the *Pastor's Pen*

### How's Your Parenting?

I recently had a friend call me on a Sunday afternoon, seeking guidance about parenting. I could hear the anxiety and frustration in his voice. My friend is not alone in his agony over the ceaseless demands of parenting. Many parents are feeling inadequate to meet the complex demands of parenting. I recently read an article in *Christianity Today*, "The Myth of the Perfect Parent: *Why the Best Parenting Techniques Don't Produce Christian Children*" by Leslie Leyland Fields. The article addressed a variety of concerns about parenting. I simply want to summarize the article (I hope parents will take time to read the full article, which can be found in the January, 2010 edition of *Christianity Today* in the Church Media Center.)

Christian parents, according to Fields, too often fixate on how their children will "turn out," that is, they are too consumed with how their children will accept and live out their parents' values, beliefs, and practices. To make matters worse, evidence all around us (and more often in our own homes) is showing that increasing numbers of our children are not following in the paths of their parents' faith. Consequently, many parents,

judging themselves (not to mention others) too harshly, are asking, "What did I do wrong?" New DNA and genetic research suggest this is the wrong way to think about parenting (the nature vs. nurture debates are far from resolved). Fields doesn't spend much time on this debate, but, I believe, points us to a healthier model for parenting, the Bible. She reminds us that the parents and families of the Bible were far from perfect (and in some cases were better described as the bad parents of the Bible). The Bible never expects us to be perfect parents. Rather the bible calls us to be faithful parents. We are called to be faithful in modeling and teaching the faith to our children. We must trust God with the outcomes. Fields concludes: "Parenting, like all tasks under the sun, is intended as an endeavor of love, risk, perseverance, and above all, faith." Let's aim to be faithful parents and trust God to work his miracle of grace in our children's lives in his own time. (*Christianity Today* offers a Bible study based on this article that I hope to teach in the future.)

### Diaconate Nominations!

In March, the church will begin the process of nominating and electing (on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of May) deacons. Deacons, you will recall from reading the New Testament, are "servant leaders." The word, in the Greek, literally means "waiter of a table." More importantly, Jesus taught us that leaders are servants: "Whoever wishes to be great among

you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:26b-28). The Diaconate of First Baptist is a servant body.

We, at First Baptist, gladly support women in ministry, whether deacons or ministers. We do so because we believe that the Bible clearly teaches women were deacons; otherwise, we'd have to "explain away" Paul's words in Romans 16: "I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church at Cenchreae." We don't explain it away; we celebrate and affirm women in ministry.

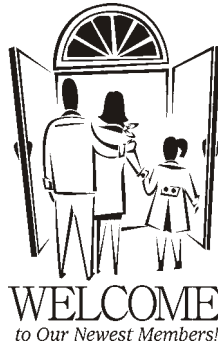
Deacons, of course, should be people of Christian faith and seeking to live out Paul's admonition to "live a life worthy of the gospel!" (Philippians 1:27). We pray that our congregation will nominate people of Christian integrity, people of commitment to Christ and to this church. The most important discipline we can practice to prepare for this process is to pray for God's leadership as we seek to elect new leaders for a new season of Christian service and leadership!

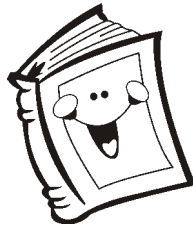

One important step in becoming a good steward is realizing God has already blessed us with many wonderful gifts. The following story helps remind us of His many wonders.

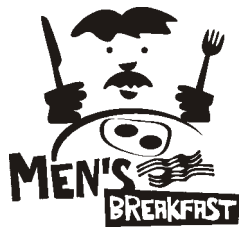

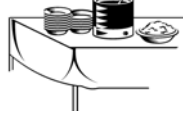
